(Costumes may **not have** a full mask, weapon or have the entire face painted). Students will trunk o treat around our parking lot visiting decorated cars. Parents will pass out goodies and also participate in a car decorating contest with a chance to win an ice cream party for their child's classroom. All Saints Day is on Thursday, November 1st in which we will go to Mass at 8:15. Students will be asked to dress up as a Saint for Mass.
